III SCHOLARLY AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The facility at Curtin will allow Nicolle and her collaborators to obtain, for the first time ever, the formation ages of impact glasses from the Apollo 15 landing site. Nicolle also presented a four-week class to Albion Area Lifelong Learners (AALL). Topics included Astronomical Walkabout: Research (and other stuff) in Australia New Views of the Moon, Mars: Curiosity Beats the Cat!, Life in the Universe and How it May Have Started.
